" PSYCHOLOGY OF ART "

Report of J.J. Sweeney :

Art, whether painting, sculpture, masic, architecture, or the dance, is primarily a language .

Like the spoken language it is constitued of a traditional skeleton of grammar and a vocabulary which is being constantly renewed .

Its immediate expression lies in its words . Words are fundamentally decayed me-

Communication is achieved only through familiar, decayed metaphors; but an art (that is an <u>eventual</u> language of communication) is heft alive by the creation of fresh metaphors.

The fresh, hence unformullary metaphor is difficult for the observer or listener to understand on first encounter. This is the barrier between the layman and give contemporary art.

But it is gift and duty of the artist to produce such metaphors towards the cohstant revitalization of art's vocabulary .

An art lives through its persistent creation of fresh metaphors which in time decay into familiar words .
